As required by Parents' Bill of Rights - SB 49; Session Law 2023-106

1a) How can my child be promoted to the next grade level?

Elementary School Promotion

Students in the elementary grades (K-5) will be promoted or retained on an individual basis based on a consideration of the following criteria: social readiness, level of parental support, making satisfactory progress in both language arts and math, and, as appropriate, achieving a III or better on the End of Grade Examinations (including retests). When a child is being considered for retention, the final decision is made, not only based on the above criteria, but also through the collaboration of teachers, administration and the EC department. Students in grade 3 must show proficiency on some measure of the Read to Achieve Legislation (BOG, 3rd grade EOG, mClass or an alternative assessments). Students in grades 3-5 should show proficiency on the End of Grade Math and Reading EOGs. 5th grade should also show proficiency on the 5th grade science EOG. The final determination of whether or not to retain a student rests with the Director.

Middle School Promotion

Before receiving a recommendation for promotion, students in middle school (grades 6 – 8) must pass four subjects, two of which must be language arts and math. Additionally, students in Grades 6-8 must score a Level III or above on their Math and Reading End of Grade Standardized Tests (including retests). 8th grade students must show proficiency on the Science EOG test. Any middle school students taking the high school courses Math 1 or Biology must pass the End of Course test and pass the class to get course credit. The final determination of whether or not to retain a student rests with the Director.

1b) What is my child learning at school? How can a parent review these materials?

In North Carolina, schools use the same Standard Course of Study, determined by the State Board of Education. These standards are the knowledge and skills students should understand by the end of each grade/course.

1c) How will a parent learn about my
child's progress in school or with a
class?

Pocosin Innovative Charter shares progress of students through a variety of ways. Midterm progress reports (approximately 4 weeks in to each quarter) and reports cards (approximately every 9weeks) are sent to parents in order to communicate student academic strengths and any areas for improvement. Feedback on conduct is also included.

In grades 3-8, parents have access to their child's grades at all times using NCSIS's Parent Portal in PowerSchool.

Parents/Guardians may request a conference with their child's teacher at any time. In addition, the school reserves a day for parent conferences each quarter.

State Assessments:

Individual Student Reports for end-of-grade/course tests and other state assessments (English language proficiency assessment) are sent to parents with the final report card. All NC students take end-of-grade assessments for reading and math in grades 3-8. Students take end-of-grade science assessments in grades 5 and 8. Some middle school students take end-of-course assessments in Biology and NC Math 1.

1d) What are the qualifications of my child's teachers?
